Truck deliveries in January 2011

Total deliveries from the Volvo Group's truck operations in January amounted to 15,277 vehicles. This was an increase of 62% compared with the year-earlier period.

Volvo Trucks

Globally, Volvo Trucks' deliveries in January were 95% higher than in the corresponding month last year.

The truck deliveries to Europe amounted to 2,805 trucks, 106% up compared to January 2010.

In Western Europe the deliveries for January totalled 2,233 trucks, which is an increase of 101% compared to 2010. Especially Germany and United Kingdom noted strong deliveries. The truck deliveries to Eastern Europe increased by 129%.

In South America the deliveries are up 33%, totalling 1,264 trucks for January.

Mack

Mack's deliveries in January totaled 1,276 vehicles, up 43% compared with the year-earlier period.

Demand, in general, continued on an upward trend, largely spurred by the need to replace the aging population of heavy-duty trucks and the positive response of customers to the Mack EPA2010 trucks featuring Mack ClearTech™ SCR technology. A notable exception was the construction segment of the market.

While there are some indications of improvement in the construction environment as a whole, underutilization of the existing fleet of dumps and mixers is having a dampening effect on new truck sales.

Renault Trucks

Deliveries from Renault Trucks in January increased by 68% compared with the year-earlier period.

In Europe, deliveries in January amounted to 3,201 trucks, an increase of 59% compared to January 2010. Sales outside Europe increased by 144%.

UD Trucks

Deliveries from UD Trucks in January totaled 2,073 trucks, which was an increase of 18% compared with the year-earlier period.

In Asia, deliveries reached 1,635 trucks, an increase of 20%. In Japan, the number of deliveries was 1,173 trucks, up 38%.

Japanese domestic heavy-duty and medium-duty truck registration increased by 9%, and UD Trucks heavy-duty and medium-duty truck registration increased by 38.5%.

Deliveries to South Africa increased by 168% to 279 units.
